
SUPPLIES & TOOLS:


- Stonehill Collection Zest quilting fabrics:
 5/8 yd stripe for bodice
 1½ yd large floral stripe for skirt
- 3/4 yd medallion print for ruffle and lining
- 14" zipper
- Thread
- Hook and eye

- Sewing machine and basic sewing supplies
- Tissue or tracing paper
- Pencil and ruler
- Iron & ironing surface
- Scissors
- Water-soluble marking pen

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. On paper draw a line for the center of the bodice front.
- 2. Measure the girl around the chest and add 1 to 2" for ease, then divide by 4 (A).
- 3. Measure down about 4 or 5 inches to where the bodice should end and remeasure the girl. Add 1 to 2" for ease and divide by 4 (B). Connect the ends of A and B to draw the side seam line.
- 4. Mark a point on the center front about 3 to 4" above chest measurement for neckline, draw line perpendicular to the center front (C).
- 5. Mark point 3 to 3½" across the neckline. Draw a line slanting outward about 1/2" (D).
- 6. Determine where the shoulder seam should be and mark (E).
- 7. Measure over 2" and draw the armhole curving out to the side edge (F).
- 8. Extend the shoulder edge up about 6½ to 7" to make the tie. Make a curved point at the top.
- 9. Compare pattern to girl's body. Make any changes needed for fit. Add 5/8" to all edges except center front.
- 10. Draw pattern for bodice back. Follow steps 11-14.
- 11. Trace bodice front.
- 12. Extend center back line 2½" to 3" (A).
- 13. Draw a line curving over to the tie at the shoulder (B).
- 14. Compare pattern to the girl's body and make any changes needed for fit. Add 5/8" to all edges.
- 15. From stripe and medallion print, cut 1 bodice front (placing center front line on fold) and 2 bodice backs.





- 16. Make a pattern for skirt front twice as wide as the bodice front by the length of skirt plus 2". Make a pattern for the skirt back twice as wide as the bodice back by the same length as the skirt front. Cut 1 front and 2 backs from large floral stripe fabric.
- 17. Make pattern for front ruffle the same width as skirt front by 3½". Make a pattern for back ruffle the same width as skirt front by 3½". Cut 1 front and 2 backs from medallion print fabric.



SEWING DIRECTIONS

- Use 5/8" seam allowance for all seams. Right sides together, stitch bodice backs to front along side seams. Stitch lining pieces together in the same manner. (FIG 1)
- 2. Stitch the ruffle backs to each end of ruffle front. (FIG 2)
- 3. Fold in half with right sides in. Stitch along ends. Trim seam allowance. Turn right side out. (FIG 3)
- 4. Make rows of gathering stitches 3/8" and 5/8" from raw edge. (FIG 4)




- Gather ruffle evenly to lower edge of bodice beginning and ending along back seam line and matching side seams, pin ruffle. Baste ruffle to bodice 5/8" from edge. (FIG 5)
- 6. Right sides together, stitch skirt backs to front along seams. Make rows of gathering stitches 3/8" and 5/8" from raw edge. (FIG 6)
- 7. Gather skirt evenly to lower edge of bodice over ruffle matching side seams. Center back edges and ending gathers 1½" from center back edge. Pin skirt while gathering. Sew skirt to bodice 5/8" from edge. Trim seam allowances. (FIG 7)



- 8. Mark a dot on seamline 15½" below neck edge, stitch center backs using a basting stitch above dot and regular stitch length below dot. Insert zipper in upper edge of center back seam above dot following manufacturer's directions. (FIG 8)
- 9. Stitch lining to bodice along edge of neck and ties. Trim seam allowance and clip corners and curves. Turn right side out. (FIG 9)
- Slipstitch lining to zipper along center back edges and along seam line of skirt. Sew hook and eye to center back above zipper. (FIG 10)
- 11. Turn under 1/2" then 1½" along lower edge of skirt. Stitch hem in place. (FIG 11)
- 12. Knot ties together at top of shoulders.
